VISITING PROFESSOR: DR. MICHAEL SCHULL

Dr Michael Schull is a Senior Scientist at the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES), an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine, University of Toronto, and the Director of the Division of Emergency Medicine (Dept of Medicine) at the University of Toronto. His research focuses on health service utilization, quality of care and patient outcomes as they relate to emergency care. His studies use administrative datasets and linkages with clinical and qualitative data, and have examined the causes and consequences of emergency department overcrowding, variations in patient waiting times, and pre-hospital care. He was previously Co-Chair of an Expert Panel advising the Ontario Ministry of Health on health policies relating to its ER Wait Time Strategy. He has over 100 publications and has received numerous national and international honours, including a Canadian Institutes for Health Research Applied Chair in Health Services and Policy Research. Dr Schull practices as a specialist in Emergency Medicine at Toronto's Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre.
