VISITING PROFESSOR:

DR. MARCO SIVILOTTI

Dr. Sivilotti is a tenured Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine, and of Pharmacology and Toxicology at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. He completed residency training in emergency medicine at McGill University, and fellowship training in medical toxicology at the University of Massachusetts, and is board certified in both specialties. He has previously been on faculty at the University of Ottawa and Harvard Medical School, and is currently on staff at the Kingston General and Hotel Dieu Hospitals. He also serves as medical consultant to the Ontario Poison Centre at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto. He is a Senior Associate Editor of the Canadian Journal of Emergency Medicine, and has served on the editorial boards of Academic Emergency Medicine, Clinical Toxicology and the Journal of Medical Toxicology. He has authored over 30 peer-reviewed papers, and over 20 chapters in medical toxicology and in emergency medicine textbooks. His research interests include risk predictors for acetaminophen toxicity, methanol and ethylene glycol poisoning and treatment, clinical decision rules, and ultrapotent agents for ED procedural sedation and analgesia and for rapid sequence intubation.
