LAURIE MORRISON, MD, FRCPC, MSc

Dr. Morrison is the Robert & Dorothy Pitts Research Chair in Acute Care & Emergency Medicine, Professor and Clinician Scientist in the Division of Emergency Medicine at the University of Toronto and Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute at St Michael's Hospital. She is the Director of Rescu, a resuscitation research program focusing on the evaluation and implementation of prehospital and transport medicine time-sensitive interventions in acute emergencies (www.rescu.ca). She has established a collaborative network to conduct RTCs and outcome validation studies in prehospital resuscitation research. She is a US National Institute of Health, CIHR, Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, and Brain Canada funded investigator.

Dr. Morrison has received the Bob Hyland Award for Excellence in Mentorship, the William Goldie Prize for outstanding contribution as a leader and scholar in Emergency Medicine, and the Helen P. Batty Award for Excellence and Achievement in Faculty Development from the University of Toronto. She has also received the May Cohen Award for mentorship from the Canadian Medical Association.
